This map is a guide, not a prescription. It is intended to help transitioning Home Team regulars understand how their service experience and professional development may relate to civilian security career pathways. Individual progression in both service and civilian careers depends on performance, potential, qualifications, and organisational opportunity. The years shown are an orientating reference only — rank progression is driven by performance and potential, not tenure. The map does not guarantee any specific outcome or career trajectory.

Entry points: SPF — Inspector (INSP) for 2nd Lower Honours; ASP for 2nd Upper Honours and above. CNB — Officer ranks broadly mirror SPF; entry at Inspector equivalent for degree holders (illustrative). SCDF — Lieutenant (LTA) for relevant degree. SPS — Superintendent-track entry for degree holders (illustrative). All Home Team officers undergo foundation training at the **Home Team Academy (HTA)**. SCDF officers undertake additional vocational training at the **Civil Defence Academy (CDA)**. PME courses and key assignments shown are illustrative — individuals should map their own specific training against the examples shown. Actual postings vary by agency, vocation, performance, and organisational requirements.

						ASIS Certifications: APP — no academic prerequisite. CPP — experience pathway available without degree; primary credential at Security Manager and above. PCI (Professional Certified Investigator) — particularly relevant for SPF and CNB officers with investigations backgrounds transitioning into corporate investigations, compliance, or due diligence roles. PSP — relevant for SCDF officers moving into physical security and infrastructure roles.					
						Note: Civilian entry may be one level below theoretical mapping where direct commercial security management experience is limited. CNB officers bring highly valued investigations and intelligence competencies for corporate fraud, compliance, and due diligence roles. SPS officers bring people management, case management, and secure facility operations skills valued in healthcare security, facilities management, and rehabilitation programme roles.
